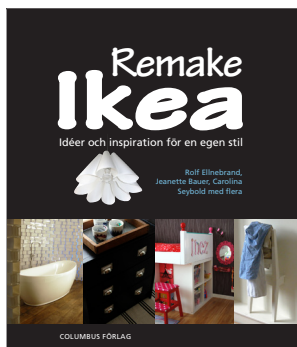

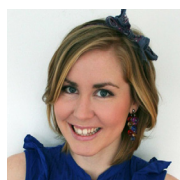
Here are ideas, step-by-step descriptions, and accessories. Most of the projects can be carried out by anyone; some of them take a little more time.
