


THE BOOK OF WHITTILING

In The Book of Whittling Felix Wink and Ragnar Kierkegaard Suttner head out on a roadtrip to visit interesting people who work with knives and axes. They interview legends, such as Wille Sundqvist, and newcomers, such as Clara Dackenberg. All share of their experiences and tell stories of inspiring whittling projects.

The book contains descriptions of 12 projects that we can tackle for ourselves— everything from ladles and spatulas, stools and table tennis rackets. Of course we are also guided through whittling techniques and tools maintenance, as well as introduced to different types of wood and the qualities of these, and a variety of finishing techniques.

The ambition of the book is to encourage the enthusiast to forge ahead on a personal voyage of discovery. A workshop is not a necessity, simple tools to work with in any place you like can achieve great results.

Refine your skills, discover the pleasure to be gained from a simple and focused, creative work.
