Finnish folk tradition lives on in knitted mittens and gloves

Coloured and textured knitted mittens and gloves were at one time an important part of Finnish men and womens' traditional festive wear. Mittens and gloves characteristic of the region with typical colours and techniques are found throughout Finland. *Traditional Mittens and Gloves* tells about the history of the hand-made mittens and gloves and their importance in Finnish culture.

The book has instructions on how to make 28 knitted and crocheted mittens and gloves in the extensive pattern section. There are samples of traditional coloured knitted mittens, textured knitted gloves for church and crocheted coloured mittens. The originals for the gloves and mittens were found in old archive pictures, books and interviews, which the author researched in order to produce instructions as close as possible to the originals.

Colourwork patterns and complex stitches are illustrated with clear graphic charts.
